## 2006 IN REVIEW

**G**OD TRULY BLESSED CHRIST FOR HUMANITY DURING THE PAST YEAR. THE MINISTRY HUMANITARIAN RELIEF EFFORT FOR 2006 TOTALED MORE THAN \$3.4 MILLION DOLLARS, GREATLY EXCEEDING 2005 ESTIMATES. OUR STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS PRAISE GOD THAT CFH WAS ABLE TO MEET PHYSICAL NEEDS AND PROVIDE SPIRITUAL HOPE TO SO MANY IN THE U.S. AND ABROAD. FOR THE THIRD

nitire, household items and medical supplies to 339 walk-in clients. Thirty-nine local ministries and 6 from other states received ministry aid to enhance their efforts for Christ among America's poor. Additionally, in August the ministry welcomed Bob Ashinhurst as its new Director of Local Outreach. Under Bob's guidance, CFH added two more Tulsa Housing Authority (THA) complexes to its Adopt-a-Facility program. To date, nine area churches minister with CFH at eleven low-income housing facilities. God willing, Christ for Humanity hopes to have a presence in all 18 THA projects within the next two years. Our Monday night 1ST STEPS program continues to flourish under Bob's able leading. CFH staff members and program mentors witnessed tremendous growth in the lives of the people attending this class.

On the international front, 2006 saw significant increases in support to missionaries working with the poor in Mexico, while containerized shipments to the areas within the former Soviet Union dropped. CFH did ship one container of medical equipment and clothing to the Ukraine and partnered with another ministry to send supplies to Solnishko. Due to increasingly complex governmental rules for shipping cargo containers under the State Department's Project Support Freedom program, this area of ministry (which once claimed the lion's share of international out-flow) is diminishing. Nevertheless, when one door closes, the Lord opens another. Our volunteer coordinators and staff members worked extremely hard to provide aid to 44 foreign ministries, joyous in the knowledge that the supplies provided are being used to show God's love and to advance the Gospel of Christ among the world's poor.

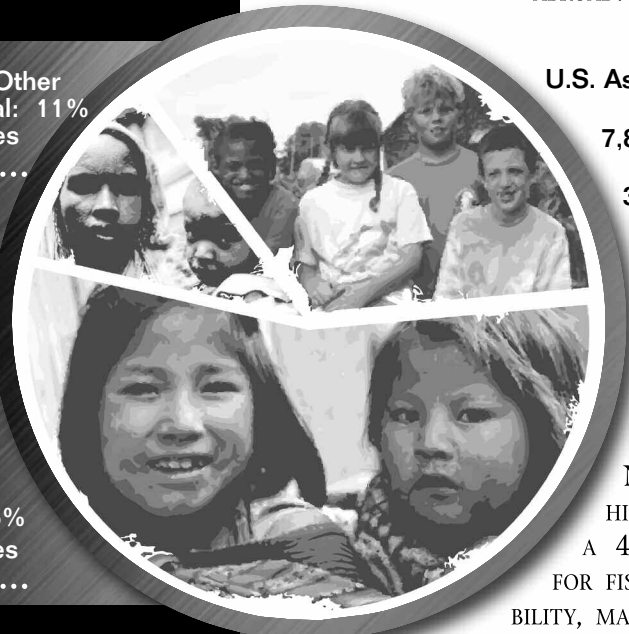

OUR PRAYER IS THAT GOD WILL CONTINUE TO USE CHRIST FOR HUMANITY IN A POWERFUL WAY DURING THE COMING YEAR FOR HIS SOVEREIGN PURPOSE.

Locally, nearly 8,000 men, women and children were fed through the ministry's Emergency Food Pantry in 2006. CFH also provided clothing, fur-

## 2006 IN REVIEW CONTINUED

**I**N EARLY DECEMBER, CFH SHIPPED A 40 CARGO CONTAINER OF MEDICAL SUPPLIES AND CLOTHING TO BOB AND JUDY VAN SANT, MISSIONARIES IN THE UKRAINE. THE VAN SANTS HAVE BEEN PASTORING A CHURCH FOR DEAF AND HEARING BELIEVERS IN SIMFEROPOL FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS. DURING THE SUMMER CFH HELD A DRIVE FOR INFANT AND CHILDREN'S CLOTHING AT THE VAN SANT'S REQUEST. THE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES WILL OPEN DOORS AT AREA HOSPITALS FOR SHARE THE GOOD NEWS WITH PATIENTS AND STAFF MEMBERS; THE CLOTHING IS DESTINED FOR AREA ORPHANAGES, WHERE THE CHURCH HOPES TO HAVE A SIGNIFICANT IMPACT FOR ETERNITY.

Ronda Tyson, Christ for Humanity's Director of Global Missions, lead a four-person mission team to The Gambia in June. Working with New Life Fellowship International, team members helped

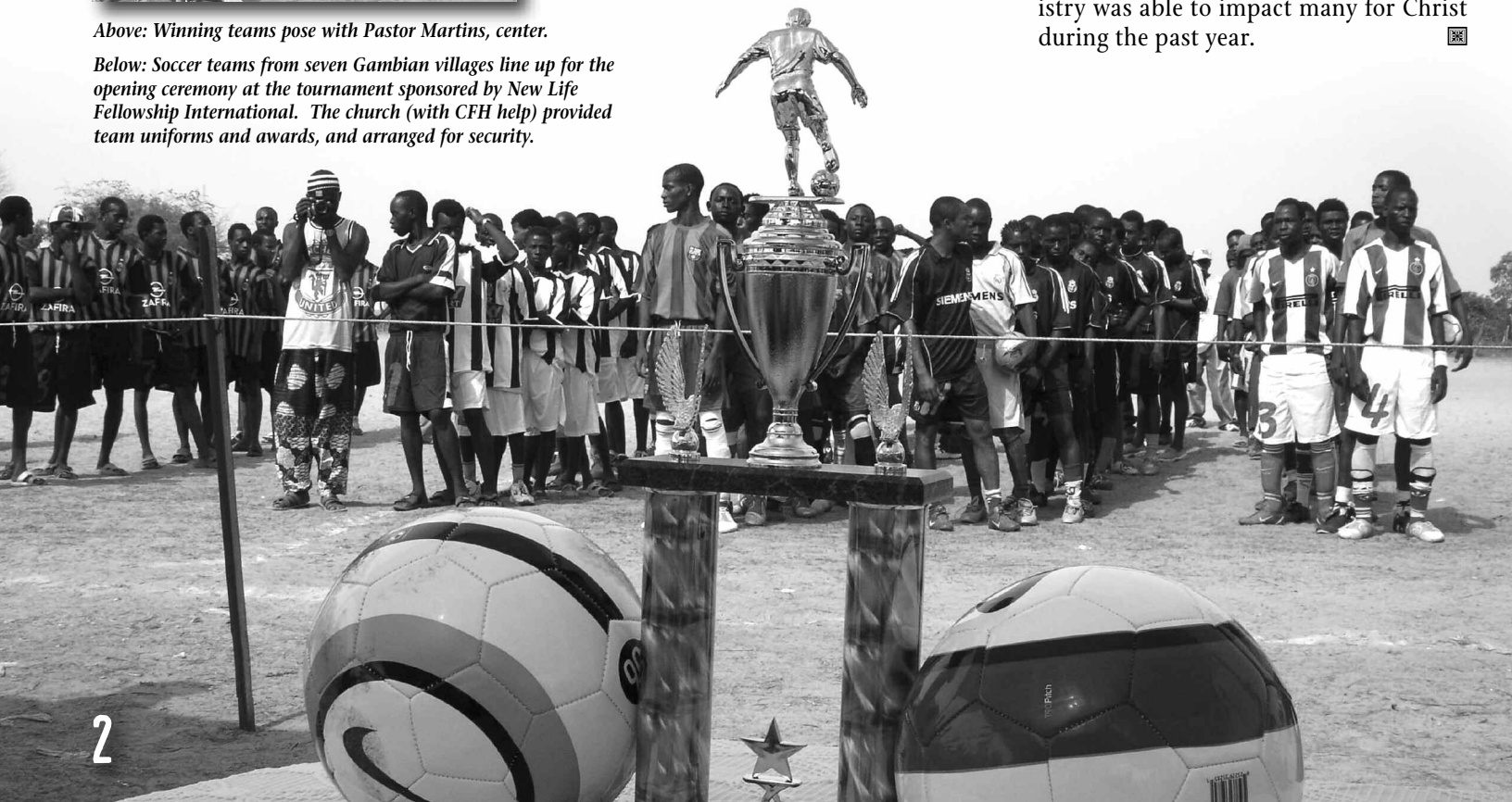

organize a soccer tournament between seven African villages during the World Cup. The tournament proved to be the perfect forum for gathering large crowds to hear the Gospel message. During the two week event, the Jesus film in a local African dialect was shown to throngs of interested viewers, and the Word of God was boldly preached to primarily Muslim crowds with great success. Villagers who accepted Christ were introduced to grounded Christians in their communities, who will help these new believers grow in their faith. The mission team members also purchased and distributed 7,000 lbs. of rice to feed hungry villagers.

Perhaps the most exciting event of 2006 was the dedication of CFH's handicap lift-bus in November. From February to October, CFH actively sought funds to purchase a bus to be used by the ministry for various local outreach programs. God provided the remaining money for a 21-seat, diesel Federal Coach at the end of October. Since ministry bus service began, CFH has been approached by several churches wanting to use the vehicle for various church events, including a weekly drug and alcohol

treatment program based on AWANA. A second night of 1ST STEPS is also in the offing. These are just the types of activities CFH hoped would result from having such a bus. The lift-bus enables Christ for Humanity to better fulfill its main purpose within the Christian community's helping the Church get out of the pew and go to the poor.

Our staff and volunteers want to extend a special "Thank you" to all those who support Christ for Humanity with prayer, through financial giving, and with in-kind donations. Because of your care and concern for the less fortunate, the ministry was able to impact many for Christ during the past year.

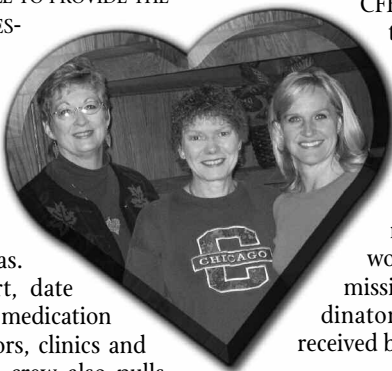
# CFH VOLUNTEERS WHERE WOULD THE MINISTRY BE WITHOUT THEM?

**C**HRIST FOR HUMANITY'S PERMANENT STAFF IS SMALL — TINA ROLLINS (DIRECTOR), CAMILLE WELLNITZ (ADMINISTRATOR), BOB ASHINHURST (LOCAL OUTREACH), RONDA TYSON (GLOBAL OUTREACH) AND JIM HENDRIX (WAREHOUSE MANAGER). WITHOUT THE HELP OF A FAITHFUL CORE OF DEDICATED VOLUNTEERS, THE MINISTRY WOULD BE UNABLE TO PROVIDE THE HUMANITARIAN AID NECESSARY TO FULFILL ITS PURPOSE WITHIN THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY.

Volunteers effectively manage the ministry pharmacy, clothes closet and medical supply areas. Pharmacy personnel sort, date and shelve the masses of medication donated to CFH by doctors, clinics and hospitals. This dedicated crew also pulls, boxes and ships orders from doctors and healthcare workers going to the mission field, providing free medication to help alleviate pain around the world.

CFH receives thousands of pounds of donated clothing. The clothing room coordina-

tors sort all donations to the ministry. Suitable items are sized and gender sorted for use in the ministry fully stocked clothes closet. The overflow is boxed and palletized for shipment overseas. The clothing room is open to the public several days a week, and volunteers are more than happy to help clients find needed items.



CFH also receives large quantities of medical supplies and equipment. Ministry volunteers inventory and box all medical supplies for use by area clinics working with the poor, for overseas shipment, or for healthcare worker going on short-term mission trips. Volunteer coordinators also help fill orders received by fax or e-mail.

## FOOD FOR MEXICO SEVEN-YEAR DROUGHT MEANS HUNGER IN THE SIERRA

**C**HRIST FOR HUMANITY'S MINISTRY ROOTS ARE IN REMOTE AREAS OF THE SIERRA MADRE MOUNTAINS OF NORTHERN MEXICO. THE FIRST MAJOR PROJECT CFH FUNDED WAS THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BIBLE CHURCH IN THE MOUNTAIN VILLAGE OF BABORIGAME (BG). PARTNERING WITH NEW TRIBES MISSIONARIES LIVING IN THE AREA, THE MINISTRY ARRANGED WORK CREWS FROM THE U.S. AND MEXICO TO HELP BUILD THE CHURCH. BABORIGAME BIBLE CHURCH WAS DEDICATED IN 1993, CULMINATING THREE YEARS EFFORT BY AMERICAN AND MEXICAN BELIEVERS.

The founders of CFH desired that Baborigame Bible Church become a beacon of light in the darkness of paganism to the Tepejuan Indians living in the area. God often demands patience from His people, and at times it seemed that the dream of bringing Christ to the

Indian population would never bear fruit. But God is faithful! For the past 13 years, our New Tribes friends have worked to learn the Tepejaun language, develop a literacy program and translate the New Testament into Tepejaun. With these task finally accomplished, the missionaries in BG are now seeing Indians in the area come to Christ.

In November Christ for Humanity learned that due to seven years of drought in the Sierra, people around BG were facing starvation. The ministry determined to help as it could and sent funds to purchase food. The food was to be distributed by the New Tribes missionaries and the church leaders. (Parts of the e-mails we received from New Tribes are reprinted to the right.)

Our staff and volunteers thank God that He is adding Tepejaun and Mestizo names to the Lamb's Book of Life through the efforts of dedicated missionaries living in the Sierra. How pleased we are that CFH

can help show the love of God to people in need, making the "Good News" of the Gospel all the more real to Indians and Mestizos alike.

## From CFH E-Mail

December 7, 2006

Dear CFH Friends!  
Just wanted to shoot a note and some photos to you about what's happening here in BG. On Sunday mornings we are averaging about 50 Spanish-speaking church attendees and on the Tepejuan side of the work about 20 or so. We have two separate services on Sunday—10 a.m. in Spanish and 12 p.m. in Tepejaun. We are all meeting in the church building that God provided here many years ago.



We want to share with you information about the money you sent for beans. We have purchased all of the beans and divided them among our two ministries in the area. The Tepejuan and Mestizo believers, along with the regular church attendees, are all receiving beans



to help them with their families' needs. Matt Arnold, Kevin Case and some of the Tepejuan believers decided how to go about handing out the beans for the Tepejaun work. Ruben Carrillo, Caspar Estrada and I (as the Spanish ministry leaders) decided how to distribute the beans on the Spanish side of the work.

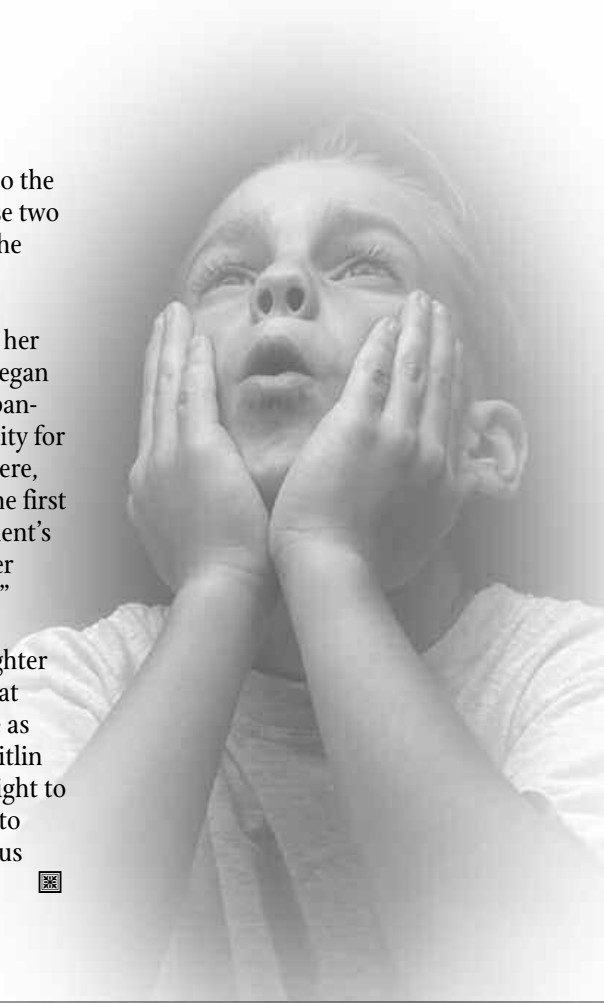
On the way into the church service, the Sunday school teacher asked her class why it was necessary to be quiet in the sanctuary. One bright child replied, "Because people are sleeping."
